

Craig Calhoun has been president of the SSRC since July 1999, and is also university professor of the Social Sciences at New York University. Calhoun received his doctorate in sociology and history from Oxford University in 1980. He has edited several books for the SSRC, including most recently *Knowledge Matters: The Public Mission of the Research University* (with Diana Rhoten) and *Robert K. Merton: Sociology of Science and Sociology as Science*, both with Columbia University Press; *Sociology in America: A History* (University of Chicago Press, 2007), and *Varieties of Secularism in a Secular Age* (with Michael Warner and Jonathan VanAntwerpen; Harvard University Press, 2010). His other recent publications include a collection of his essays, *Nations Matter* (Routledge, 2007). His current research focuses on problems of humanitarian action, on the history and renewal of public institutions, and on the current economic crisis in comparative and historical context.
